

4. Activating Baltic languages in Mac OS X Panther

Macintosh OS X 10.3



One of the less known features of Mac OS X Panther (OS X 10.3) is the welcome addition of Baltic language support. Users now have the ability to write in Estonian, Latvian and Lithuanian in just about any Macintosh application.

1. From the **International** Preferences Pane (located in **System Preferences**) select the **Input Menu** tab, scroll down the list until you see the Central European scripts and check the desired Baltic language.



2. After closing the **International** Preferences Pane click on the flag at the top of the screen and you will notice that the new Baltic flag now appears in the keyboard menu. Before you begin writing in any of the Baltic languages make sure that the flag has been selected and appears at the top of the screen.
3. The new **Formats** tab will also allow you to change the date, time and currency options for any of the three Baltic languages.
