

1. Configuring Web browsers for the Baltic languages

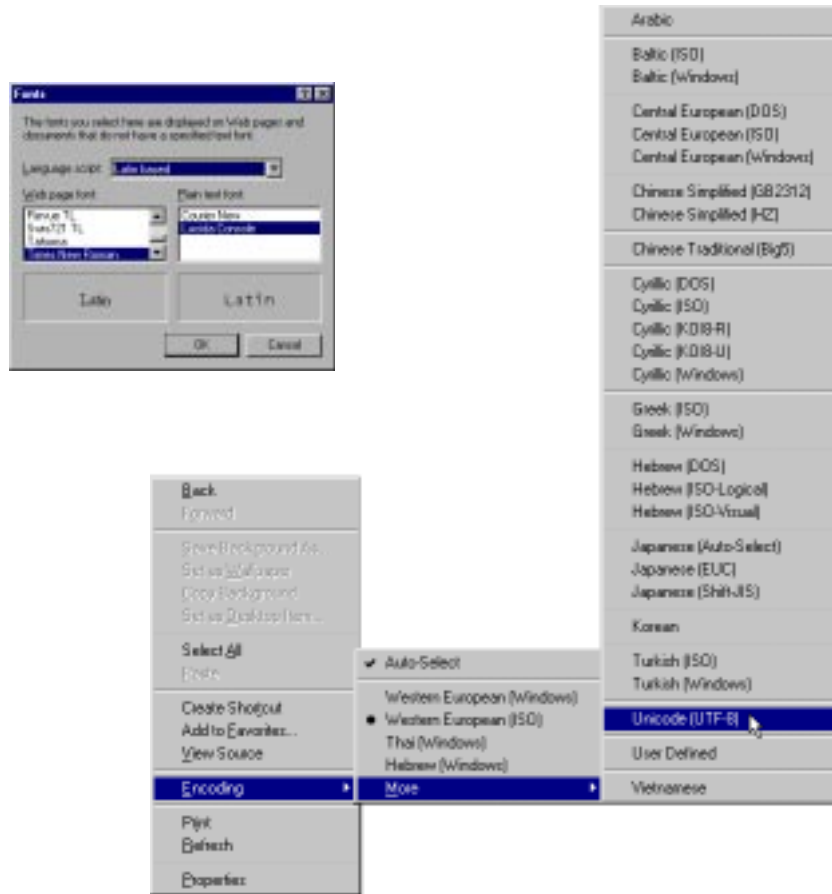

Internet Explorer 5.5 provides full support for Unicode and will use several fonts to display a single Web page that contain multiple scripts for which you have selected fonts.

1. Select **Internet Options..** on the **Tools** menu, select the **General** tab in the Internet Options dialog box and click the **Fonts...** button to choose a language script and the Web page (proportional) font and plain text (fixed width) font to be used with it. The Baltic languages belong to the Latin based language script.



2. From the Encoding menu you can see which character set or code page Internet Explorer 5.5 has chosen to view the current Baltic Web page. Confirm that either the **Unicode (UTF-8)** or **Baltic (Windows)** encoding has been selected.
3. Check that the Baltic text is displaying all diacritics correctly by trying out the following popular Baltic Web sites:
